

Frontiers in Ecology and the Environment

Embargo Policy

The authors of manuscripts accepted for publication by *Frontiers in Ecology and the Environment* agree to abide by the following:

Before the paper's online publication date,

- Authors should not overtly seek media attention and should not release their paper or any part thereof (e.g., results) to the press or public. However, authors may present their paper's findings at scientific conferences and seminars, but (again) should not overtly seek media attention.
- Authors are permitted to distribute copies of their accepted paper (saved in its entirety as a single PDF, which prominently denotes that the paper is currently "in press") to selected colleagues within the research community, but preferably through an online repository, one in which access is limited to only a select number of chosen recipients (i.e., not publicly accessible). In such cases, *Frontiers* staff would need assurances from the authors that no one (the authors, selected recipients, etc.) shares the PDF with anyone else, and that no one intentionally seeks media attention.
- Once the galley proofs of their paper are available, authors will be notified by email. At that time, authors may share copies of the galley proofs with (or grant interviews to) reporters, if those reporters agree to refrain from referencing the paper in any news medium until after the online publication date. Also once the galley proofs arrive, *Frontiers* staff would likely be able to estimate the paper's online publication date. After receiving your galley proofs, if you or your institution are planning a press release, please contact Heidi Swanson, the ESA Public Information Manager (heidi@esa.org). If possible, it would be ideal if your media colleagues include the journal name (*Frontiers in Ecology and the Environment*), the title of your paper, and the DOI link somewhere within their respective press releases.

After the paper's online publication date,

- Authors may distribute copies of their paper as they wish, including postings on personal or institutional websites.
- Authors may seek media attention, including participating in interviews and contributing quotes or material to press releases relating to their paper.
